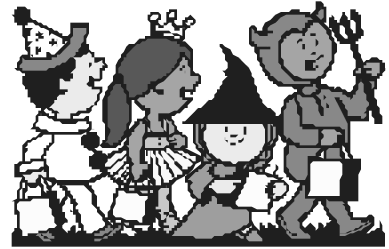


Supporter for job-wanted mother

Physical handicap is such as a functional paralysis of heart, kidney, or respiratory organ and so on. If you want to vaccinate, please inquire to your nearest office of city hall.
